Dear LEA ELPAC Coordinator:

The accessibility pilot for the fall 2019 computer-based English Language Proficiency Assessments for California (ELPAC) for students with disabilities has been extended. The accessibility pilot window will remain open through November 22, 2019. **If the local educational agency (LEA) has English learner (EL) students with disabilities and is interested in participating in the accessibility pilot, please respond to Sara Querubin at squerubin@ets.org no later than November 19, 2019.**

During the accessibility pilot, LEAs will administer the computer-based ELPAC training tests to ELs with disabilities. The pilot will provide opportunities for them to explore and interact with the accessibility resources available on the computer-based platform prior to the operational administration of the Summative ELPAC in February 2020. After administering the training test and using the accessibility resources now available in the computer-based ELPAC, test examiners are asked to complete an [ELPAC Accessibility Pilot Post-Test Survey](#) to share feedback about the administration. The results of the pilot survey will be used to develop recommendations to facilitate the next steps in the computer-based ELPAC development for ELs with disabilities. **It is important to note that all data collected will be treated confidentially. No names of individuals or institutions will appear in any research records or reports.**
